Challenge Quilt



Challenge Quilt reminder: The "brown bags" have been chosen. Time to put on the thinking cap and get to work.

Theme: At the Seashore

Size: 72" perimeter, any shape Materials: Fabric may be added to your 3 fat quarters. Quilt must be 3 layers, quilted, with batting in the middle.

Ideas:

Birds, seagulls, sand bucket, rocks, towels, sailboats, waves, seaweed, beach roses, grass, crabs, turtles, fish, light houses and sand castles.

Keep an index card with a 1" x 1" cut of each of your 3 brown bag fabrics to display with your quilt. It will be fun to see how the fabrics were used.
