Rosemary is a nationally recognized contemporary quilt artist, and she has recently been accepted (for the third time) into the famous Quilt National '17 show at the Dairy Barn Art Center in Athens, Ohio. Check out their website:

Rosemary creates surface design on white fabric using multiple techniques, including dyeing, screen printing, mono printing, painting and batik. She then composes her quilts using the fabrics that she has created. Rosemary will be sharing her work with us in the form of a lecture, slide show and trunk show, describing her techniques, her influences, the artists she admires and the processes she employs in creating her art.

Board Meeting Highlights

A meeting of the Wayside Quilter's Guild Board was held on Saturday, Nov. 19, 2016. Highlights of their discussion follows.

President Position: remains unfilled. For the time being decisions will be shared by Kathie Cromwell (treasurer), Tica deMoor (Programs) and Carol McCreary (Secretary).

Financials: Kathie Cromwell is changing the accounting from a cash method to an accrual method. Easier to keep track of accrued years and quilt show results.

Quilt Show Analysis 2016: No vendors, No advertisers, No cost raffle quilt, higher custodial costs at venue = significant profit. Looking into why the higher custodial costs.

Quilt Show 2018: September 29-30, 2018. Mark your calendars.

Baptist Church & Senior Center: We donate \$50 per usage at the Baptist Church and \$60 per usage at the Senior Center. Will try to use the Senior Center more because of lighting.

New England Quilt Museum: We historically donate \$200 per year. The Board voted to donate up to \$600 this year. Looking into the donation levels.

Membership: There are currently 51 members of which 7 members are new this year. Approx. 30 members attend monthly meetings. Would like membership to be around 75-80. Encourage carpooling to meetings, have more sew together opportunities, will have a survey soon to ask members what they want.

Monthly Meeting Content: Speakers every meeting is costly. Want to change to 4-5 speakers per year and use other meetings for member activities.

Newsletter: Only current paying members receive the Newsletter. Any other friends or interested persons can find all our news on the website.

Tax Exempt: currently a C4 status but Kathie believes a C3 is better for our group. Looking into the change of bylaws on this.

Next Board Meeting: is scheduled for Saturday, February 11th at 1:00 pm at the home of Kathie Cromwell. Members are encouraged to attend.

Outreach

On that bitter cold week before Christmas, 12 quilts were given to the residents at Pathways Shelter in Framingham. The administrator I gave them to was grateful and wants you all to know they are very much appreciated. The next day Marilee heard about the family in Sudbury who lost everything to a fire. We donated two quilts to a family friend who was collecting items for them. Now, our stash is nearly out!

Last June we gave 26 quilts to camp Erin, the children's bereavement camp. In August, we gave close to another two dozen quilts to Reach House in Waltham for domestic violence victims and to Trust House associated with the VA for women veterans. All three of these groups were most appreciative and hope to be included in our 2017 outreach.

Let's use these cold winter days and nights to create more tops to be sandwiched, quilted, bound or labeled for our next outreach day March 11th. I look forward to seeing the talent and generosity you all bring to our guild's outreach!

Peabody Historic Society Miniature Quilt Challenge

Quilters of all levels are invited to participate in the Peabody Historical Society's third annual miniature quilt challenge: "Inspired by Time: Women of Peabody." Participants will choose one woman from a selection of historical Peabody women and create a miniature quilt inspired by her life story, historical time period, or quilt examples dating from her lifetime. There is no entry fee to participate in this challenge.

Submissions for "Inspired by Time: Women of Peabody" will be exhibited at the Smith Barn on **April 1 & 2, 2017**. Visitors will have the opportunity to cast a vote for their favorite quilt, and Viewers' Choice ribbons will be awarded to the top three entries, including a \$100 cash prize for first place. This event will also feature an exhibit on the Women of Peabody throughout the Nathaniel Felton Senior House.
